Tar River Transit (TRT) hereby gives public notice of its policy to uphold and assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, and all related statutes. Any person who believes they have been aggrieved by an unlawful discriminatory practice regarding TRT's programs has a right to file a formal complaint with TRT. Any such complaint must be in writing and submitted to the TRT Title VI Coordinator within one hundred eighty (180) days following the date of the alleged occurrence.
