

Title VI Notice to Public

Tar River Transit (TRT) hereby gives the public and its employees notice of its policy to uphold and assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, and all related statutes. Title VI and related statutes prohibiting discrimination in Federally assisted programs require that no person in the United States of America shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal assistance. A copy of this notice can be found at the downtown Transfer Center at 111 Coastline Street in Rocky Mount and in the Tar River Transit Administration office located at 100 Coastline Street in Suite number 315.

Any person who believes they have been aggrieved by an unlawful discriminatory practice regarding TRT's programs has a right to file a formal complaint with TRT. The complaint should include the following information:

- Name;
- Address;
- Contact Information (i.e. telephone number, email address, etc.);
- How, when, where, and why you believe you were discriminated against; and
- The location, names, and contact information of any witnesses.

Any such complaint must be in writing and submitted to the TRT Title VI Coordinator within one hundred eighty (180) days following the date of the alleged occurrence. Also, a complainant may file a complaint directly with the Federal Transit Administration ("FTA") office of Civil Rights, Attention: Title VI Program Coordinator, East Building, 5th Floor – TCR, 1200 New Jersey Avenue, SE, Washington, D.C. 20590.
